PHS MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Prophetstown High School is to provide an educational environment with a commitment to academic progress that enables students to appreciate individual and cultural diversity, make responsible decisions, communicate effectively and to become life-long learners and accomplished citizens, workers and consumers.

Disclaimer: This handbook is not intended to create a contractual relationship with the student; rather, it is intended to describe the school, its current practices, procedures, rules, and regulations (or code of conduct). The guidelines described in this Handbook are not intended to be complete, but to provide a framework for student behavior and responsibilities. Membership or participation in a school-sanctioned activity is a privilege and not a property right.

Surveillance Warning: All people entering district buildings and/or occupying a district bus are subject to be videotaped at any time.

Use of Electronic Communication Devices: Use of cell phones, electronic paging devices, and other electronic communications technology is not permitted during instructional hours. Possession of such devices will be restricted if they interfere with the educational process.

In addition, each principal, within his or her school, may establish certain written rules and regulations not inconsistent with those established by the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools.

ATTENDANCE

Reporting Absences: High School Office Phone 815-537-5161

In the case of absences from school, the parent/guardian of the student should call the high school office prior to 8:30 a.m. on the day of the absence. **All absences, for any reason, require a phone call from a parent or guardian.** Any absence not approved as excused within 48 hours (2 school days) after the student's return to school will become unexcused. Any absence without parent/guardian notification that is not resolved with the principal's office within 48 hours (2 school days) will become a truancy. Any absences for medical reasons extending 5 school days or beyond will require a doctor's excuse for readmission.

When parents wish to pick up their child's homework, they should contact the office to make arrangements. **Students will have one day per one day absence in which to make-up work missed.** Any student who leaves school without permission is truant. Truancy (skipping school/class) will incur

disciplinary action. Students leaving the school before dismissal time must sign out in the office and may do so only after parent contact. Only school personnel are able to clear those students. In case of medical appointments in the middle of the day, prior notice should be given to the office and a physician's excuse presented upon return. Students are also required to sign in at the office when arriving at school if arriving after school has started.

Students are expected to be prepared for school and all classes. Items needed for school/class, such as: books, homework, papers, projects, items for speeches/presentations, clothing for PE/Personal Fitness, lunch money or sack lunches should be brought to school in the morning. Students will not be allowed to leave the building to collect these items from home.

ATTENDANCE POLICY: Board Policy: *TYPES OF ABSENCES*

Excused:

1. personal illness
2. bereavement
3. quarantine
4. family emergencies
5. observance of religious holidays
6. written requests **approved in advance** by the administration

Unexcused: Any absence other than listed under excused.

Anticipated Absences: In the case of anticipated absence, i.e. vacations, etc. the following procedure shall be followed: Requests for necessary absence from school should be written five days prior to the absence by parents or legal guardians and taken by students to the office. Students will take a slip to each teacher for notification. In such cases the reason for absence must be approved and arrangements made for make-up work with teachers prior to the absence. For extended absences for anything other than illness, all assignments are due upon return.

TRUANCY & UNEXCUSED ABSENCES: **Truancy** is defined as absence without valid cause for a school day or portion thereof. "Valid cause" is defined as illness, death in the immediate family, family emergency, and situations beyond the control of the student as determined by the school board or circumstances that cause reasonable concern to the parent for the safety and health of the student. Disciplinary action will occur in cases of truancy, in addition to a grade of "0" being recorded that day for the classes the student missed.

Unexcused absences are to be defined as absences from school with parental knowledge and/or approval, but not classified as excused by school policy. In those cases disciplinary action may occur; however, work may be made up and credit will be given.

Truant/Unexcused Absences:

Step 1: When a student is absent 5 days without valid cause, a letter of concern will be mailed to the parents. *The parents are then required to show proof via a doctor's excuse if the child is absent again.*

Step 2: If the student is absent 6 days without valid cause, another letter is sent to the parents. **A referral will be sent to the Whiteside County Truants' Alternative Program, and a caseworker will then meet with the family.**

Excessive Absences and/or Tardies:

(Excluding suspensions, extended illnesses, and approved vacations.)

Step 1: When a student is absent 10 days, excused or unexcused, a letter of concern will be mailed to the parents.

Step 2: When a student is absent 15 days, excused or unexcused, a letter of concern will be mailed to the parents. *The parents are then required to show proof via a doctor's excuse if the child is absent again.*

Step 3: If the student is absent 16 days, another letter is sent to the parents. **A referral will be sent to the Whiteside County Truants' Alternative Program, and a caseworker will then meet with the family.**

ABSENCES WITHIN THE SCHOOL: Absences or excused tardies due to approved school field trips, necessary co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, counselor appointments, disciplinary consultation and the like, shall not be counted, provided a student has a pre-approval from the classroom teacher, office personnel, or other staff member.

COLLEGE DAYS: Seniors will be allowed 2 excused college visits per year.

1. Students should register on-line with the college of their choice.
2. Students should inform the guidance counselor of the date and take a notification slip to their teachers for approval.
3. Student should print out the itinerary from the college and turn in to the attendance secretary for verification. If verification is not received, the absence will remain unexcused.

Juniors wishing to make a college visit should discuss the possibility with the guidance counselor.

TARDIES: Any student who is tardy to class more than 10 minutes will be considered truant for the entire period.

Five (5) tardies will result in a one (1) hour after school detention. Each additional five (5) tardies will result in a one (1) hour after school detention. When a student reaches 25 tardies a one (1) day in-school appointment will be issued; at 35 tardies, a two (2) day in-school appointment will be issued; and at 45 tardies, a three (3) day in-school appointment will be issued. Continued tardies will result in loss of noon hour privileges (student will be required to eat his/her lunch in the office).

ATHLETICS/ACTIVITIES

ACTIVITIES DISCIPLINARY POLICY: IHSA sanctioned activities will be limited to students who are enrolled full time in the district. In order to be eligible to participate in non-IHSA extracurricular activities, students who reside in the district must be enrolled in at least one course, preferably related to the participation.

Prophetstown High School Rules and Regulations

Any student participating in one or more extra-curricular activities at any time during the school year shall be governed by this policy, beginning with the first day of practice in the first sport/activity for which a student goes out in high school and continuing through the last day of the student's senior year. For those programs which begin practice prior to the first day of school, this policy shall be in effect during these times. Should a student violate the rules and regulations and not be participating in an interscholastic sport/activity at the time, the student suspension will affect the next interscholastic sport/activity in which he/she is participating.

All offenses against the Athletics/Activities Policy are accumulated over the student's four years in high school. The Athletic/Activities Policy is in effect 365 days a year and 24 hours a day.

ATHLETICS/ACTIVITIES TRAINING POLICY: Any student involved in extra-curricular athletics/activities who admits to, is seen by or reported by district staff or parent(s) of the student, for possession or consumption of alcohol, illegal drugs or tobacco or is determined to have been in possession or consumed alcohol, illegal drugs, or tobacco based on a report from law enforcement officials, court officers, or a newspaper account, will be disciplined in the following manner:

1st Offense--No participation in interscholastic contests, performance or involvement in the organization for thirty-three percent (33%) of the total season or school year as appropriate for the organization. The penalty will carry over as needed for the next season/year for the remaining percent not served. Participants are required to practice until the suspension is complete.

2nd Offense and Subsequent Offenses--No part in interscholastic contests or school organizations for one (1) calendar year from the day the administration notifies the student that he/she has violated this policy. The student participant may practice but may not dress for contests during the suspension. Students who choose to practice will be subject to all other team rules.

(A suspension period will not begin until all previous suspension periods have been completed.)

Violation of Civil, Juvenile, or Criminal Laws--Any arrest or conviction of a student participant by law enforcement officials or a court of law for participating in or aiding in any crime will be in violation of the athletic/activities policy. Violations may be treated with a written reprimand, temporary suspension, or dismissal from the team/activity after a review by the student's present head coach/sponsor (or next head coach/sponsor if the student is not in a sport season/present activity), a minimum of two other head coaches/sponsors, the athletic director, and the principal.

APPEAL PROCEDURE: If within ten (10) days of a ruling, the participant convinces the head coach/sponsor or Athletic Director that there is just cause for an appeal, the Athletic Director will arrange for the participants to meet with the Athletic/Activities Committee for the purpose of appealing the ruling. This will apply to the "Training Policy" Offenses and any "Violation of Civil, Juvenile or Criminal Laws".

ATHLETIC/ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE: This committee consists of the principal, athletic director (chairman) and the head coach/sponsor in each sport/activity. The committee will be the interpreter of the training rules, will act as an appeals board and will decide any related matter not covered within the rules. The athletic director will file all decisions of this committee in written form.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE & PARTICIPATION:

1. A student participant must be in school the whole school day to practice or participate for that day.
2. The principal may grant permission in an emergency or unusual situation, when the participant is unable to be in attendance the entire day.
3. An athlete who has a scheduled medical/dental appointment on the day of an event, game, or practice must notify the office in advance and provide a verification slip from the clinic, doctor, or dentist in order to participate that day. The student must be in attendance a minimum of four (4) class periods during the day to participate.
4. All fees, including, but not limited to: book rental, class fees (i.e. Art, Driver Education, Science, Home Economics, Tech Ed, Music) and sport fees must be paid, or arranged to be paid in installments, in order to participate in a sport, club/organization, musical, etc. Some fees may be waived if the family has filled out a Fee Waiver Form and it is approved by the unit office.

HOLIDAY PRACTICES: On actual, official holidays, if a practice is called, it is voluntary. There will be no punitive action against a student who chooses not to participate. Open gyms and practices on Sundays shall be held upon the approval of the Principal.

ATHLETIC PHYSICAL EXAMS: All participants in any sport must have a physical examination completed before starting practice. Physicals must be recorded on the IHSA Physical Exam Form.

Freshman athletes may use their regular high school entrance physical.

ELIGIBILITY: Eligibility requirements apply to all IHSA activities or contests, music and drama activities, cheerleading, as well as athletic events. **A student must have passed four academic subjects in the previous semester.** Eligibility will be determined on the last day of each week and will apply to the following week's contests. Any student serving a suspension on the day of a contest will be ineligible and cannot dress or participate in any inter-scholastic contests. Students that are excused from P.E. classes by a doctor's excuse cannot participate in athletic contests until released by the doctor.

DISCIPLINE

DISCIPLINE: Discipline will be administered as needed. Detentions/referrals (**ASD**), in-school suspensions (**ISS**), out-of-school suspensions (**OSS**), probation, discipline contracts, Saturday school appointments (**SSA**), and expulsion will be used. Appropriate law enforcement officials may be notified and their assistance requested to handle some disciplinary matters.

Violations may include but are not limited to the following:

Electronic Device Policy: (Cell Phone/Pager/Text Messaging/CP Player/MP3/Etc.): **Use of cell phones, electronic paging devices, and other electronic communications technology is not permitted during instructional hours. Possession of such devices will be restricted if they interfere with the educational process.** Electronic devices may be used during the student's designated lunch period. Consequences: 1st Offense: Device will be confiscated and returned to the student at the end of the day. Student will receive a two-hour ASD. All following offenses: Device will be confiscated and returned to a parent/guardian at the end of the school day. Student will receive a two-hour ASD. Students who refuse to turn over the device will be assigned an additional two-hour ASD or an ISA.

Detentions/Referrals (ASD/After School Detention) will be assigned at the discretion of the teacher or the principal. Twenty-four hour notice will be given.

1. Students will have one (1) week from the date of infraction to serve his/her ASD. Written notice will be provided to the parent if the detention was not served.
2. Students who refuse to serve ASDs or make arrangements to serve ASDs will be issued an ISS. A student who continually refuses to serve ASDs could be considered as a student not in good standing and would not be allowed to attend extra-curricular/social functions (i.e. homecoming, prom, picnics, etc.). After five (5) ISS have been issued for unserved

ASDs, the student may be prohibited from participation in the above listed events.

3. Students may not attend or participate in sporting events, or other extra-curricular/social functions unless disciplinary matters are served/resolved.
4. Un-served disciplinary actions including but not limited to detentions, violations of the acceptable use policy, and referrals that are not served for any reason by the end of the second semester will be enforced at the beginning of the next semester the student is enrolled in school.

*An **After School Detention (ASD)** is a 1 hour quiet study hall that runs from 3:05-4:05 p.m. every day school is in session. Detentions may also be served before school in the office (from 7:30-8:00 a.m.) for those students who are unable to serve after school due to work/sports. Students are to sign in upon arrival with the supervisor of the detention room. No talking, listening to CD players or other music devices, eating or sleeping is allowed in After School Detention, Saturday School Appointment, or In-School Suspensions. Students should bring work with them to detention.*

*A **Saturday School Appointment (SSA)** is a 4-hour quiet study hall that runs from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. – check calendar for 11-12 dates.*

Consequence for ASD or SSA violation:

1st offense – verbal warning

2nd offense – removal from ASD or SSA

Students will be responsible for their own transportation following an **ASD** and their own transportation to and from **SSA**.

In-School Suspension (ISS) requires students to report to the office at the assigned time. *ISS is a daylong, quiet study hall. No eating, drinking (except during lunch), talking, listening to music, game playing, or sleeping is allowed.* Students will be supplied with class work and will receive credit for work completed in **ISS**. Work is due upon student's return to class. Students will eat lunch in the in-school room. Violations of **ISS** rules may result in the student being removed from **ISS** and placed on external suspension.

Out-of-School Suspensions (OSS) require students to be placed on probation, to be sent home and to be prohibited from appearing on school property or at any school sponsored activity from the time the student is suspended until the student is readmitted. When returning from a suspension, the student will report to the office and meet with the Principal or Counselor before going to classes. Upon readmission, all homework is due.

OSS Suspensions may be assigned as follows:

1-3 day external suspension

3-5 day external suspension

5-7 day external suspension

7-10 day external suspension and recommendation for expulsion

We, the faculty, staff and administration of Prophetstown High School, are committed to providing our students with the best education possible. To do so, we must maintain an environment conducive to learning. Therefore, it is necessary to formulate and enforce rules designed to create, maintain, and support a learning-centered environment and atmosphere.

Bullying Policy: Students may not use any form or type of aggressive behavior that does physical or psychological harm to someone else and/or urge other students to engage in such conduct. Prohibited aggressive behavior includes, without limitation, the use of violence, force, noise, coercion, threats, intimidation, fear, bullying, racial epithets, hate speech, personal/negative graffiti, text messaging and/or emails of a threatening or harassing nature, or other comparable conduct.

Sexual Harassment will not be tolerated. Sexual harassment may include but is not limited to:

- Unwelcome sexual flirtations or propositions.
- Verbal abuse of a sexual nature.
- Sexual or “dirty” jokes.
- Graphic verbal comments about an individual's body.
- Sexually degrading words or written messages used to describe an individual.
- Displays of sexually suggestive objects or pictures.
- Unwelcome touching, such as patting, pinching, or constant brushing up against another's body.
- Sexual gestures or graffiti.
- Talking about sexual activity in front of others.
- Spreading rumors about other students.
- Any acts of retaliation against an individual who reports a violation of the district's sexual harassment policy or who participates in the investigation of a sexual harassment complaint.

Students or staff members are to **immediately** report incidences of sexual harassment to the principal or his/her designee. Each complaint of sexual harassment shall be promptly investigated in a way that respects the privacy and humanity of all parties concerned. Students found to be sexually harassing other students will immediately be suspended. Additional progressive discipline procedures may be applied. The School District prohibits retaliatory behavior against any complainant or any participant in the complaint process.

Expulsion may result for acts of gross disobedience or misconduct. Gross disobedience or misconduct of students shall include, but not be limited to, instances of the following:

1. Injury or threat of injury to any school district employee, official or student.
2. Possession, use or distribution of a dangerous weapon/ including “look-alikes”.

3. Explosives
4. Setting off the fire alarm
5. Bomb threats
6. Destruction and/or defacement of school property.
7. Possession, use, distribution, purchase or sale, or if found to be under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance on school property or at any school function.
8. Disobedience of directives from staff members or school officials and/or rules and regulations governing student conduct including discipline contracts.
9. Other such conduct that poses a danger to persons or property or disrupts the educational process.
10. Continued/multiple discipline issues which indicate a lack of ability or desire to comply with the school rules and regulations.

Probation may be assigned as a result of inappropriate behavior at either home or away activities, on a school bus or field trip. Possible consequences of probation are exclusion from school and to not be on school premises from 3:00 p.m. until 8:00 a.m. The conditions of the probation will be set at a probation conference.

REMOVAL FROM CLASS: Teachers in Prophetstown-Lyndon-Tampico C.U.S.D. #3 shall have the authority to remove students from their classroom who are disruptive or act in a manner that is detrimental to the academic atmosphere of the classroom environment. The principal and teachers shall determine the length of time for which the student will be removed from class or school. The following shall occur:

- 1st removal:** Conference with principal, and assignment of disciplinary action.
- 2nd removal:** Conference with parent(s), counselor, teacher, and principal.
- 3rd removal:** A student **may** be removed from class with an "F." A student who is removed from class has the right to due process as outlined in Board Policy Manual which is available in the Unit Office.

Immediate removal may result in cases of gross misconduct.

Due Process: The Board of Education and administration will protect the student's rights. The students will have the following rights: To hearing the charges/evidence; to respond to the charges; to be informed of the decision; to hearings with principal, superintendent and/or board.

DISTRICT CONDUCT/DRESS CODE: General appearance should reflect good grooming and good taste. The students' behavior can be affected by their appearance. **Enforcement Statement** – Dress Code expectations shall be enforced at all school functions whether it is a home or away event and are applicable to both student spectators and participants.

1. Students are expected to treat the faculty, staff, visitors, other students and school property with dignity and respect.

2. Students should keep the school building and grounds safe and clean by taking proper care of school and personal property. Students should not write or mark on school property. Students should not litter school grounds.
3. Students should dress appropriately during the entire school day. Students shall not wear clothing or practice grooming which is unsafe, unsanitary, distracting or offensive to others, or destructive to property. All students are required to wear footwear at all times. Head coverings, including hats, caps, hoods, visors, and bandanas, are not to be worn in the building unless directly related to a school activity. Items may be confiscated and may not be returned.
4. The body from mid-thigh to shoulders will be covered. This means short-shorts, halter tops/spaghetti straps, see-through clothing, mini-skirts, sleepwear or clothing that exposes personal undergarments will not be allowed.
5. Students should demonstrate good judgment in what they wear. Language or emblems on clothing that promote or advertise drugs, alcohol, tobacco, chew, sexually transmitted diseases, violence, racism, hatred, discrimination, satanic practices, corpses, gang affiliation, or contain profanity or sexual innuendo are not permissible.
6. Any piercing which is deemed unsafe or distracting to the educational environment will not be allowed.
7. Students participating in Awards Night, NHS Induction, Fine Arts Festival, Graduation, and/or other special occasions are expected to “Dress Up” and look nice (dress jeans and shirts/tops are allowed). Clothing must be within the dress code. At Graduation, boys must wear pants/slacks that are visible below their gowns. Boys and girls must wear decent shoes – NO FLIP-FLOPS. Leather sandals are acceptable. One exception to the above statement, with the exception of Graduation, is that if students are participating in a game such as baseball, on the same night, and the student does not have time to go home and change, they may wear their uniform.
8. Students may not wear jewelry or accessories that constitute a hazard. This includes: studded necklaces and bracelets, chains and large/sharp objects.
9. Students may not wear coats to class without teacher approval.
10. Students may not wear/carry book bags, purses, or other large bags to class.
11. Students are expected to limit their display of affection.
12. Language/Gestures: students are not to use inappropriate, vulgar, or offensive language or gestures.
13. Electronic Devices/Cell Phone Use:
 - a) High School: Students may bring electronic games, MP3 players, CD players, or cell phones to school; however, if use of these devices becomes a distraction to the educational process/environment they may be confiscated.
 - b) Middle School: All devices are to be in the student’s locker.

- c) Elementary School: No Devices are allowed at school.
14. Students who have courses that require safety equipment or special dress codes must adhere to wearing the proper equipment and/or clothing. Failure to comply may affect a student's grade and/or participation in the course.

All students must be enrolled in 6 academic classes **plus** physical education. For each semester, students will be assigned to no more than 1 study hall. Exceptions to this will be rare, due to extenuating circumstances, and only with the approval of the principal.

BREAKFAST/LUNCH PROGRAM

BREAKFAST/LUNCH POLICIES: Students may deposit money into a meal account. Deposits should be placed in an envelope labeled with the student's name. Deposits may be brought to the kitchen prior to 8:05 AM. After 8:05 AM, deposits may be made in the high school office during lunch hours only (11:20 – 11:50 for A lunch and 12:08 – 12:38 for B lunch). Meal accounts can be accessed through the district's finger scanning system. As students are scanned in the lunch line, the cost of the meal, and milk that is purchased with sack lunches, will be deducted from their account. If a parent calls or send a note, money will be transferred from a sibling's account; however, this will not be done automatically. **No charging is allowed.**

Students who do not have money in their account will not be given a breakfast meal or hot lunch. They will receive cereal for breakfast and a peanut butter sandwich for lunch for a three-day period of time. Parents are encouraged to pack a lunch for their children until money can be deposited into the meal account.

Students will eat in the cafeteria. White 1%, white skim milk, or chocolate 1% milk are available. Students receiving free/reduced meals must pay for extra milk or ala-carte items. Students who bring a sack lunch must pay for milk. Students are expected to maintain an orderly and mannerly lunch line, use proper table conduct, throw litter in the designated container, and return trays and utensils to the window.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: To enter 9th grade a student must be a graduate of the eighth grade or the equivalent, must present a school physical signed by a physician, and include proper immunization verification, BMI (Body Mass Index), and verification of dental checkup. **Any student entering an Illinois school for the first time must have a physical examination reported on an Illinois physical examination form.**

CLOSED CAMPUS POLICY: Once a student has reported to school in the morning, the student may not leave the campus without formal permission from the high school office. Absence from the campus or from any class without permission will be considered truancy. No one goes home or leaves campus for lunch. No exceptions.

ELECTED OFFICERS: Any student elected as a club officer, class officer, or a student council member must achieve a cumulative 2.00 GPA. Student Council has a constitution which will be followed in the event that officers fail to perform their duties. In all school clubs, elected officers may be removed from office after 3 unexcused absences from meetings/events, non-performance of duties, or gross violation of school rules. In this event new officers will be appointed or elected for the remainder of the school year.

FIELD TRIPS: The Board of Education encourages field trips when the experiences are an integral part of the school's curriculum and contribute to the District's desired goals. Fees for food, lodging, and to defray the cost of transportation are the responsibility of the student or organization unless otherwise stipulated. In order to attend a school sponsored field trip, a signed parental permission form must be on file.

FINAL EXAMS: Graduating seniors may be excused from taking second semester final exams providing:

1. An “A” has been earned. The instructor will determine grading criteria.
2. The student has exhibited regular attendance throughout the school year.*
3. The teacher does not require the test.

*Regular attendance is no more than six days of absence (three days for semester courses). No days may be unexcused absences. In the case of extenuating circumstances exceptions could be considered.

HOMEWORK: Learning at home is an essential part of good education. Collaborative home-school learning begins as soon as children enter the educational system. Prophetstown-Lyndon-Tampico # 3 schools recognize the important role parents have in supporting their children’s learning and encourage parental involvement in home-school tasks or homework.

Homework serves a number of purposes:

1. Extends school learning
2. Reinforces skills and understanding
3. Develops a home-school partnership
4. Develops skills and attitudes needed for lifelong learning

Homework assignments are determined by individual grade level teachers. These are instructional decisions that will vary from teacher to teacher. Each teacher will share specific homework practices and expectations at the beginning of the year. These practices and expectations will include:

1. The frequency of assigned homework
2. The estimated amount of time students might be expected to spend completing homework
3. The weight of the homework in determining report card grades (when applicable)
4. The guidelines for returning graded/marked homework to students by teachers

INTERNET ACCESS: Federal law and state Internet Access requirements govern the District’s use of the Internet. The District abides by all of these requirements. For student protection, students in District #3 are only allowed to use email or chat rooms under teacher supervision for a class curriculum-related project. All Internet use shall be consistent with the district goal of promoting excellence by facilitating resource sharing, innovation, and communication and in accordance with the District’s Acceptable Use Policy (AUP). The use of the District’s electronic network is a privilege, not a right. The first violation of the Acceptable Use Policy is suspension of Internet and/or computer privileges for one week. The second violation is six weeks. The third violation is a one-semester suspension of Internet privileges. If a student goes to a pornography site, it is an automatic one-semester loss of computer privileges.

LIBRARY/MEDIA CENTER: The Library/Media Center provides reference and recreational reading materials in electronic and paper format. Books, magazines, pamphlets, pictures, and audiovisual materials and equipment are available. Books, materials, and some equipment may be checked out of the Library/ Media Center by following appropriate procedures. The Library/Media Center rules are enforced to maintain a healthy learning environment for all students and adequate library materials and equipment to meet curriculum needs. Students are responsible for returning materials and equipment borrowed in the same good condition. They may be subject to fines. Lost items will be assessed at the value of the book/item according to new prices in our catalog. When individually using the Library/Media Center, students must sign in to use the library or computer lab. Students must sign in when entering and sign out when leaving the Media Center.

Books and all other materials and technology in the Media Center/Library are for the use of all students. In order to maintain ready access of materials, students are expected to return library books by the due date assigned. Students may renew a book once for three weeks. Overdue books are assigned a fine of 5 cents a day. Unpaid fines and unreturned books will result in loss of the following privileges: ability to check out additional books and materials, loss of computer access, and loss of privilege of using the Media Center. If a student loses or destroys a book or any other item checked out from the Media Center, he/she is responsible for the cost of a replacement.

LOCKERS & PADLOCKS: **The school is not responsible for items stolen from lockers.** Each student will be assigned a hall locker (lockers are available during PE class). It is recommended that lockers be locked at all times. Except in rare cases approved by the principal, **only school issued padlocks will be used. These padlocks will be loaned to the students for use on school lockers.** If a padlock is lost, stolen, or vandalized, the student will be responsible for the replacement cost of the lock. School issued padlocks will be returned to the office at the end of the school year. Any padlock not returned will be the responsibility of the student. Students are not to share their combinations with anyone. **Students are responsible for the contents and security of their locker.**

MOTOR VEHICLE & PARKING LOT: Driving to school and parking on school property is a privilege. All students wishing to park on school property must fill out a Parking Permit Application and display a Parking Permit tag. There will be no fee for the Parking Permit tag. All tags must be returned to the office at the end of the school year; if not returned in good condition a \$5.00 fee will be assessed. Approved students may drive to school providing the privilege is not abused. Irresponsible driving may result in loss of driving privilege. Once obtained, the Parking Permit tag must be displayed by hanging on the rearview mirror with the number visible at all times during school hours. Students are not allowed to use the visitor parking spaces.

The following information will be required on the Parking Permit Application: Name and signature of student; name and signature of parent/guardian; make, model, year and color of car; driver's license number; license plate number; proof of insurance. If there is more than one vehicle that the student may drive to school, there will be space provided for information regarding additional vehicles.

Students will not be allowed to use their motor vehicles during the school day unless they have a work permit and are leaving for work, they are part of an internship program which requires them to drive, or have a Vocational Driving Pass. Any and all exceptions must be approved in advance by the Principal in writing. Permits/Passes for these exceptions must be kept on the student. The student must show the permit/pass to any staff member who requests to see it. All vehicles must be parked in the student parking lot in a responsible manner.

Students will not be allowed to be in their vehicles during the school day without the permission of the office. Students will not be allowed to sit in or on their vehicles during the school day.

The staff parking lot is closed to everyone but staff Monday – Friday. Students should be dropped off in front of the school only.

By agreement between the city, school district and park district boards, the parking lot is considered the same as a city street and all laws will be enforced.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION EXEMPTION POLICY: This policy allows students in grades 11 and 12 to request exemption for the following reasons:

1. The student needs to take a specific course which is not included in existing local or state graduation standards, but is required for admission to an institution of higher education.
2. The student is a participant in at least two interscholastic athletic programs, and remains a participant for the entirety of both seasons. This is a pass/fail grade and therefore will not figure into honor roll or GPA.
3. The student lacks sufficient course units or required courses necessary for graduation.

Student requests for exemption must be made to the Guidance Counselor and approved by the Principal.

Physical education attire will be required. Students will supply their own towels. Towels and attire must be washed regularly. Girls' bathing suits must be one-piece or a bikini with a Dress Code compliant T-shirt worn over it.

REPORT CARDS/PROGRESS REPORTS: Report cards for students will be issued for the semester grade only. We will issue progress reports (see below) at approximately 5 weeks, 9 weeks (quarter grade), 14 weeks and then the final grade at semester. The students' final grade will consist of semester exam (20%) and semester grade (80%).

Progress reports for students who are in danger of failing will be sent home to parents. In addition to the progress report, information regarding parent/teacher conferences will be sent with the 5-week report and information regarding semester test will be sent with the 14-week report. The 9-week report will be handed out during the parent-teachers conferences.

For parents who have internet access (www.plt3.org), grades as well as attendance and discipline information can be viewed at any time. If you do not have a user name and password, please contact the school.

SCHEDULE CHANGES: All schedule changes must be made at registration or between registration and the 1st day of classes. Changes must be approved in writing by parents/guardians, the teachers involved, the school counselor, and the principal.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES & DANCES: Activities and dances are only for Prophetstown High School students, faculty and invited guests. All guests must be between the ninth grade through the age of twenty. Any students wishing to bring a guest to an activity or dance must submit the name, age, address, telephone number and school of attendance of the guest to the head sponsor of the activity or dance by 3:00 p.m. on the Tuesday prior to the event. All guests that are students must be in good standing at their own school. Ultimately, the sponsor and the principal will make the final approval of all guests. Persons known to have been convicted of a felony may not attend school dances and activities as a student or a guest.

Any person attending a function at PHS will be expected to remain inside the building. A person leaving the building without permission may not return.

Students must be in good standing to participate in school functions. A “student in good standing” will be a student who has no detentions, suspensions, or other disciplinary measures pending completion.

SCHOOL SPIRIT: Students should support their school by keeping their scholastic standing high and achieve to the extent of their ability. Participating in extra-curricular activities that match their interests and abilities enriches students’ school experiences.

School spirit is achieved by: showing courtesy toward fellow students, teachers, and officials; showing pride in everything our school endeavors to accomplish and has accomplished; demonstrating good sportsmanship.

PHS SCHOOL SONG:

Cheer, Cheer for old Prophetstown - Wake up the echoes with their renown.
Send a volley cheer on high - Shake down the thunder from the sky.
What though the odds be great or small - Old Prophetstown will win over all.
While our loyal sons are fighting - Onward to victory.

STUDENT COUNCIL: The purpose of the Student Council is to foster good citizenship, encourage student participation in promoting the general welfare of our school, provide a channel for expression of student opinions, coordinate co-curricular activities, and foster the spirit and reputation of our high school.

STUDY HALL: Students need to be prepared for study hall. Students should bring study materials and a pass if they intend to leave study hall. Games, playing cards, radios, TV videos, tape players, CD, MP3 players, or cell phones are not permitted in study hall.

Any student being sent to a study hall should carry a pass and present it to the study hall teacher. Study halls are intended to be quiet areas conducive to study.

USE OF TELEPHONE: During the school day, school phones are not available for the personal use of students. The office staff will handle emergency calls. Please inform your family and friends that non-emergency messages will be delivered by the end of the school day. Access to school phones is limited and meant for emergencies during the school day.

VISITORS: Parents are encouraged to visit school at any time. Please make arrangements through the teacher or the principal's office. All visitors are to report to the principal's office to receive a visitor's badge. For the safety of our children no one is to be in the building without reporting to the office first. Notifying the school of the day, time, purpose of the visit will insure that the students are engaged in activities that the visitor wishes to participate in or observe.

DUAL CREDIT/WACC

DUAL CREDIT CLASSES: Prophetstown High School offers dual credit classes from Sauk Valley Community College (College Algebra, College English, and C N A classes) and Highland Community College (Building Trades class). Students who drop or receive a D or F in dual credit classes will be required to reimburse Prophetstown High School for the cost of the course. Students will also be required to purchase the textbook for the dual credit class(es) that they are enrolled in.

WHITESIDE AREA CAREER CENTER (WACC) - POLICY

FOR PHS STUDENTS: If a student misses the WACC bus he/she should report to the PHS office for afternoon supervision, or he/she will be considered truant.

A student is expected to maintain responsible conduct on the WACC bus to and from Sterling.

Driving passes will no longer be generated at PHS. The only driving passes for students to drive to WACC that will be approved are those that are generated by WACC teachers and/or administrators. WACC issues driving passes for the following instances: fundraising purposes, internships, and for students who are bringing in their vehicles to be worked on. If a student wishes to have a job after school, he/she must schedule work times to begin after such time as the WACC bus arrives back at school @ 2:45 and the time it would take for the student to get to his/her job site. Students and their parents are encouraged to make doctor appointments in the same manner. If there is a conflict between appointments and WACC classes, the student should not go to WACC and must provide a notice of appointment/date and time seen by the doctor from the doctor's office so that the absence from WACC may be excused.

Tuition for WACC is \$1,200 per student and it is expected that the students maintain regular daily attendance. **Students may be dropped from WACC for three (3) unexcused absences/truancies.** Since the PHS and WACC calendars do not always coincide, each system has different days off. On early release days, WACC students will be required to attend WACC classes and provide their own transportation from school to home.

If a student is suspended from either PHS or WACC, the student will be placed on suspension from BOTH.

Attending WACC is a privilege which may be rescinded if a student cannot abide by the policies above. If the student's grades or behavior at PHS or WACC become a problem, a student may be dropped from WACC, or not be allowed to return a second year. No student who has missed in excess of 10 days in the previous school year **or** has a GPA below 1.7 **or** has consistently demonstrated a lack of ability or desire to follow school rules **or** has consistently shown an inability to get to class on time will be allowed to be involved in the WACC program. (Exceptions may be made at the Principal's discretion.)

Students who drop classes at WACC **after** the 1st week of a semester, or who intentionally stop attending so as to be dropped from classes may be assessed the tuition cost of \$600.00 for that semester. If such a student is unable to pay this amount of money, he/she may work off the debt by working for the school for the current student wage rate. This work would be done during the afternoon time that the student would have been attending WACC.
